

# Wilson County Board of Education

1 The School Nutrition Program will be operated on a nonprofit basis and will comply with all rules and regulations  
2 pertaining to nutrition, health, sanitation, internal accounting procedures, and service of foods and will meet all  
3 state, federal, and local requirements necessary for participation.

4

5 The system's food service supervisor will oversee the program. All products and services necessary for the  
6 operation of the school nutrition department shall be procured using the Board approved procurement plan which  
7 must comply with federal and state purchasing procedures.

9 School nutrition may include the following programs: National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast  
10 Program, Summer Food Service Program, and After School Snack Program. Meals and snacks that are offered  
11 shall meet the federal requirements for reimbursement as defined by federal regulations.<sup>1</sup>

13 As required for participation in the School Nutrition Programs, the Board agrees to the following:

14

- 15 1. Meals/snacks must be made available to all students in attendance.
- 16 2. Free and reduced price meals/snacks must be made available to students who are determined eligible  
17 for these benefits.

19 Students will be permitted to bring their lunches from home and to purchase allowable beverages and ala carte  
20 items at school.

21

22 The sale of competitive foods must be in compliance with all local procedures, but at a minimum must be as  
23 stringent as the current federal regulations concerning competitive foods.<sup>2</sup>

25 Procedures for implementing guidelines established by the State Department of Education, School Nutrition  
26 Program are on file in the district food service procedures manual.
