1 Local boards of education may adopt policies permitting students who are enrolled in grades 9-12 and who have
2 taken the equivalent of high school level courses to earn unit(s) of high credit for these courses. Students may
3 earn credit toward graduation upon passing a comprehensive written examination in accordance with standards
4 determined by the local board of education. High school credit may not be given by examination in American
5 History.¹

- 1 Students will be given the appropriate comprehensive written examination as required for students in
2 grades nine (9) through twelve (12) who earn credit for graduation;
- 3 The examination shall provide evidence that the students have mastered all of the course objectives in
4 the applicable curriculum framework adopted by the State Board of Education and shall be scored and
5 graded on the same scale as for students who enroll in the course for which credit is being given; and
- 6 Upon successful completion of the course and examination, the student will be enrolled in the next
7 highest level of the course, (i.e., students completing Algebra I advance to Geometry, students
8 completing Spanish advance to Spanish 2).

9 To insure that proper advancement is recognized, the Director of Schools shall develop procedures for
10 administering and scoring the examination and recordkeeping.
