1 The Wilson County School Board, believing that the cooperation of a school and home is a vital ingredient to the
2 growth and education of each child, recognizes its responsibility to keep parents informed of student welfare and
3 progress in school.

4
5 The Board directs the establishment of a system of reporting student progress, which shall include written reports
6 and parent conferences with teachers and shall require all appropriate staff members to comply with such a
7 system as part of their professional responsibility. The Director of Schools, in coordination with staff members,
8 will develop procedures for reporting student progress to parents which:

10 1. Ensure that both student and parent receive ample warning of a pending grade of "failure", or one that
11 would adversely affect the student (i.e. a drop of two letter grades, missing assignments, major tests,
12 etc.).
- 13 2. Enable the scheduling of parent teacher conferences at such times and in such places as will ensure
14 the greatest degree of participation by parents.¹
- 15 3. Specify the issuance of report cards at intervals no greater than nine (9) weeks, with all schools using
16 the same interval.
- 17 4. Ensure a continual review and improvement of methods of reporting student progress to parents.
- 18 5. Ensure the inclusion of the State Board of Education end-of-course examination test scores in the
19 student's grade as follows:

- 21 ■ Results of individual student performance from all administered end of course/gateway test.
22 This result shall count up to twenty-five percent (25%) as per the State Department of
23 Education of the student's grade in the semester in which the test was administered.

25 The Director of Schools shall establish suitable uniform procedures for marking and reporting the progress of
26 students to their parents. Exceptions to the uniform plan may be authorized by the Director of Schools.
